Level of Study

Undergraduate and Postgraduate

Purpose

The Gosling Ornamental Horticulture Bursary supports undergraduate and postgraduate students interested in the production of ornamental plants.

Background

This bursary is supported by the combined funds of the Ornamental Horticulture Trust Award and the M. W. L. and N. Gosling Bequest.

Value and Tenure

The value of the bursary is determined each year from the interest earned on the capital. In recent years this has been \$1,500.

At the discretion of the University all, or part, of the annual interest may be reinvested to maintain the value of the capital fund so the scholarship may not be granted each and every year.

The bursary is offered annually as funds permit and the tenure is for a single academic year.

Typical Number on Offer

Typically, one bursary is offered each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- enrolled full time in a programme of study in horticulture that is relevant to the production of ornamental plants
- enrolled at Massey University's Manawatū campus.

Selection Criteria

The selection is based on:

- · academic merit
- the benefit to the applicant and their study in receiving this scholarship, and how well the applicant meets the conditions and intentions of the scholarship

In recommending the award, the scholarship committee will take account of other scholarships and bursaries held with a view to achieving a reasonable distribution of monies among qualifying candidates.

Selection Committee

The bursary is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee, College of Sciences.

The University Scholarships Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants and its decision is final.

Conditions of the Bursary

The bursary may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.
